The PhD students of the Augustin Cournot Doctoral School organize the first edition of the Augustin Cournot Doctoral Days (A.C.D.D.), which will be held on April 15th-17th, 2004, at the Université Louis Pasteur, Strasbourg, France. The aim is to offer a stimulating environment in which international PhD students and young researchers can meet and exchange their ideas with local and international experienced researchers.

PAPERS

We are solliciting research papers which focus on important and topical issues regarding all major fields of research studied in Economics, Management and Science & Technology Studies (banking, econometrics, environmental and public economics, experimental economics, finance, history of economic thought, history and sociology of sciences and technology, industrial economics and organization, management, retailing, theory of innovation ...). Criteria for paper selection include not only the contribution of the paper to the relevant literature in the area, but also the paper's ability to stimulate meaningful dialogue among the participants.

MEETING ORGANIZATION

Accepted papers will be presented in parallel sessions. The proposed format is a 20-minute presentation followed by a 10-minute general discussion. Two plenary sessions are scheduled at the beginning and the end of the meeting with the participation of experienced senior researchers.

SUBMISSION

Interested PhD students are expected to submit an extended abstract (500 words, 3 keywords and/or JEL classification) in electronic form (PDF or Word) to the following address: doctoraldays@cournot.u-strasbg.fr. The submission should include the author's name, laboratory's and/or doctoral school's name, postal address, phone number and email address.

DEADLINE

Deadline for submission is **February 2nd 2004**. Authors will be notified by **February 27th 2004**. The final paper should be sent no later than **March 12th 2004** to appear on the website of the doctoral days (http://cournot.u-strasbg.fr/acdd).

FEES: 40 euros, covering registration, organisation and meals.
